• Foureye Butterflyfish – 6 in., large oscillated spot (false eye) at back. Fins yellowish.



• Blue Chromis- 5 in., bright metallic blue with black running along top & bottom of body. Tail deeply forked.



• **Stoplight Parrotfish** – 2 ft., Terminal phase (TP): yellow stoplight on gill cover and/ or yellow stoplight at base of tail. Initial phase (IP); pinecone or Indian corn pattern.




• **Blue Tang** (Surgeonfish)- 15 in., yellow to white scalpel, slightly steeper profile & more prominent lips then other Surgeonfish; juvenile yellow.



• **Bicolor Damselfish** – 4 in., black fore-body, white rear-body, juvenile: tri-color varies greatly.



• **Fairy Basslet**- 3 in., Bi-color with lavender fore-body and yellow rear-body. Black spot on fordorsal, black streak through eye. Elongated ventral fins. Often found hovering "upside down" around cavelets on walls in mid-depth.



• Bluehead (Wrasse) – 6 in., TP brilliant blue head. IP yellow and spot on dorsal fin; "Blob on Blue".



• Yellowtail Snapper- 2 ½ ft., Brilliant yellow mid-body stripe and tail. Snout more pointed then similar Yellow Goatfish.



• Sergeant Major (Damselfish) – 7 in., "stripes" like stripes on a Sergeant Major's uniform; black with yellow. Male guarding eggs- blue body wash overall.



• French Grunt – 1 ft., Diagonal patch of stripes below lateral line: French designer stripes; "cigarette smoke".



• Yellowhead Wrasse- 8 in., "eye lash" markings all phases.



• Indigo Hamlet- 6 in., diamond shaped, small seabass, blue with unevenly spaced white body bars.



• Yellowtail Damselfish- 7 ½ in., large black body with yellow tail. Juvenile (Jewelfish); blue with bright blue iridescent dots- tail, clear to yellow.



• Bar Jack – 2 ft., bright blue & black border (bar) on back runs along base of dorsal fin and onto lower tail fin.



• Sharpnose Pufferfish- 4.5 in., White to pale yellowish tail has dark borders.



• **Creole Wrasse**- 12in., Mottled purples and pinks sometimes with yellow and black, Black blotch on head. Juvenile: pink to purple with white body bars.



• **Redband Parrotfish** – 11 in., TP; black tips on tail, reddish band from corner of mouth to below eye, IP- White spot below rear dorsal on tail base.



• **Striped Parrotfish** – 13 in., unlike similar Princess no border on top and bottom of tail in all phases. Juvenile may have yellow nose.



• Schoolmaster (Snapper) – 2 ft., Fins yellow like a school bus, visible canine teeth.



• **Threespot Damselfish**- 5 in., Spot one on upper side of tail base, spot two in base of pectoral fin, spot three yellow of upper eye lid. Juvenile: yellow with additional larger black spot on back and lower dorsal fin.



• **Graysby** (Grouper) – 1 ft., three to five dark spots on back along base of dorsal fin; "Grazed by bullets". Rounded tail with spots overall; juvenile white stripe runs along ridge of nose.



• **Banded Butterflyfish** – 6 in., two wide, black mid-body bands.



• **Rock Beauty** (Angelfish) - 12 in. Bright yellow with black covering from behind head on. Tail yellow, blue marks surrounding eyes, orange border on anal fins, grayish beak-like mouth.



• Spanish Hogfish- 2 ft., Mauve "Spanish Shawl" on back. Juveniles (white mid-body stripe) are cleaner fish.



• Brown Chromis- 6 ½ in., border of dorsal fin and tips of tail fin yellow. Dark spot at base of pectoral fin.
