

2021 WINTER PRINT: FALSE CLOWN ANEMONEFISH

Thank you for your donation during REEF's winter fundraising campaign! Your contribution makes REEF's work possible, including protecting marine habitats, studying ocean species, and inspiring others to take action.

Each year, we select an image from my personal photo library as a gift for our most generous donors. I'm pleased to share a signed copy of this year's image, featuring a group of False Clown Anemonefish, *Amphiprion ocellaris*, with their host sea anemone. This anemonefish species is found throughout the tropical Pacific, from the Andaman Sea to northwest Australia, as well as central Indonesia, the Philippines, and southwest Japan. I photographed this image near Alor Island, on the southeastern edge of the Banda Sea in Indonesia.

In exchange for food and safety from predators, anemonefish drive off intruders and keep the anemone host clean and healthy. In the same way that REEF teams up with scientists, agencies, conservation partners, and ocean enthusiasts like you, the fish and anemone work collaboratively and depend on one another.

I hope that this print reminds you that we are all better together, and the importance of working as a united front to protect our precious marine environments.

For all the photography enthusiasts, this picture was taken with Canon 5D using a 70mm lens, SUBAL 5D housing and Ikelite 160 substrobe.
