



2025 WINTER PRINT: PAJAMA CARDINALFISH

Thank you for your donation to REEF! Your contribution fuels REEF's work to protect ocean life through citizen science, education, and research.

Every winter since 1996, REEF has shared a special tradition with our most generous supporters: a limited-edition marine life print selected from the photo library of REEF co-founder and pioneering underwater explorer, Paul Humann (1937–2024).

Paul's images helped inspire REEF's work from the very beginning, and his extraordinary legacy lives on through these photographs, our programs, and the countless people he moved to care about the ocean. Beginning in 2024, Ned and Anna DeLoach have continued this tradition by selecting a print from Paul's catalog.

This year's limited-edition photograph features a Pajama Cardinalfish, *Sphaeramia nematoptera*, named for the unique pattern of dark spots and bands that resemble a pair of pajamas. With its striking red iris and elongated second dorsal fin, this small reef fish is a standout. Pajama Cardinalfish shelter among branching corals in protected bays and lagoons throughout the western Pacific Ocean, including Indonesia, Philippines, Micronesia, Fiji, and the Great Barrier Reef.

Paul captured this image in 2007 in West Papua, Indonesia, with his Canon EOS 5D in Subal housing. This photo is a vibrant reminder of the beauty and diversity your support helps REEF protect. Thank you for being part of this enduring REEF tradition.
